It's a question we hear at camp every summer. Being given the opportunity to answer that question is the reason many of our summer missionaries give for why they serve at camp. Hoping for an opportunity to lead a child to Christ is the reason why, when I was 14 years old, I wanted to work at camp.

Almost 20 years later, I can still remember the two boys and the excitement they had on their faces when I finished praying with them. I helped make a difference in the lives of those two boys. While I knew the opportunity camp gave me to impact the lives of others, what I didn't realize at the time was the impact it was having on my own life. At 16 years old I was given my first leadership role at camp, at 18 I began program directing, and then at 22 years old I was accepted into my current role as Executive Director. Throughout my whole life, God has used camp to mold and shape me. It was at camp that I took my first steps of faith. But the ministry of camp has done so much more to disciple and train me: it allowed me to *grow* in my faith.

Building God's family means so much more to us at KLBC than just sharing the gospel and hoping to lead children, youth, and adults to Christ. Building God's family means walking with our campers and our missionaries and helping them to grow in their faith. It is why intentional mentorship has become a mainstay for us at camp. It is not enough for us to just share Christ with our campers, we want to see them and our mission team sell out fully for Christ.
